- A. Expectations for whichever assignment you choose
  - 1. Min. 4 pages
  - 2. APA in text citations and Works Cited page
  - 3. Uses our Triangle Model of an Argument for paragraphs
  - 4. Organized around a main truth claim(THESIS)
  - 5. Supporting truth claims (topic sentences for body paragraphs)
  - 6. Clear writing by using our model and iceberging 1-liners
  - 7. Quotations and paraphrases are 'sandwiched' between your sentences/ideas
  - 8. No block quotes!
  - 9. Quote no more than 1 sentence at a time!
  - 10. 3-3.5 paragraphs/page: NO more, NO less!
  - 11. The Final Version is due the last day of class!
  - 12. use this handout as a checklist
- B. regime change/ideology based Semester Essay, please follow these guidelines
  - 1. Use Kinzer and
  - 2. at least one scholarly source retrieved through Healey resources
  - 3. Build on MiniEssays, DEJ's and feedback
- C. Final Academic Self-Assessment Expectations

Add to you Midterm by:

- 1. Revising at least one MiniEssay according to the Instruction, the triangle model, and all feedback
- 2. Practicing academic self-assessment for the MiniEssay revision(s)
- 3. Retrieving, annotating and using at least one scholarly source that deals with at least one CAP that you're writing about
- D. Critical Reading and Thinking Expectations
  - 1. Take nothing at face value
  - 2. Thinking critically about your own truth claims, ideologies, etc
  - 3. Read inferentially: for shouts and whispers



- 4. Avoid overgeneralizations by avoiding "absolute" concepts, eg., *always, completely*,
- 5. Avoid overgeneralizations by using "qualifying" concepts, e.g., *often*, *many*, *sometimes*

FYI: These expectations are the same grading criteria.
