- 1) You <u>must</u> reference *ideas* that are not your own, and you must put quotation marks around *words* that are not your own.
 - a) Quotations:

Reference all ideas in the text of quotation or paraphrase (direct quotations longer than three lines should be indented and single-spaced & include p.#).

b) References:

Complete information so someone else could find the book or article, for example: in the text (Milburn, 1978), with in the references:

Milburn, M.A. (1978). Sources of bias in the prediction of future events. *Journal of Organizational Behavior and Human Performance*, 21, 17-26.

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- 2) Use a word-processor with a spell-checker. Take the time to learn this skill if you don't have it already. Computers are provided free for you to use.
- 3) Spelling:

perceive affect use of apostrophes
receive effect -possessive (sing. & plural)
-contractions

"a lot" is two words

"data" and "media" are plural

4) Misc:

Underline titles of books, magazines, and newspapers

5) Avoid sexist language:

inappropriate appropriate man people
